## COUNCIL REPORT: MARCH 2023

Council met on Zoom on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> March. In attendance were John Buchanan, Colin Carbert, Paul Davies, Mike Dewhurst, Huw Jones, Ian Stangoe, Allan Turner and Keith Youngman with apologies from Alfred Tarring who was feeling unwell.

Chairman read Psalm 62:5-8 with the thought that we have complete confidence in our God who is our rock, salvation, fortress and refuge and that we can trust in Him at all times and in all circumstances.

Council agreed again this year to

pay for the insurance indemnity and forego choir contributions as funds are still increasing year on year, mainly due to donations from choirs (e.g. Purley and Yorkshire) which have ceased to function.

There are steady sales of CDs and DVDs through the website and still a good stock at the moment to meet demand. Choirlink continues to be well received with many choirs contributing articles for inclusion. Council expressed their thanks to Vaughan for producing an excellent prayer letter/magazine.

Areas are beginning to see an increase in events with Festivals, church services and senior citizen housing complexes restarting. This provides encouraging news regarding the core work of the movement. It is with deep sadness that I have to report the closure of Yorkshire (East) Male Voice Praise.

We never recommenced after Covid restrictions were lifted due to my health problems.and falling numbers.

It has been a privilege serving the Lord via the Male Voice Fraternity. I started with MVP in 1968 in the Dumfries choir under leadership of Bobby Orr. When the Dumfries choir finished I joined Carlisle MVP under leadership of George Payne, Willie Hope being area leader for Cumbria. I later became area leader for Cumbria after Willie's Homecall. I became assistant secretary to Dennis Balmer with festival responsibilities. When George was called home Ian Owen took on reins of conducting and made me his assistant conductor.

When the Lord led Sylvia and me to Yorks (Scarborough) I joined York choir at that time led by Bert Claxton. I remember well my first visit to the choir at York. Bert said we need to discuss the future of the choir as he felt he could no longer continue as area leader for York or as a conductor for the choir. It looked as if the choir was going to disband. I said that if no one else was prepared to take on responsibility, I would, but didn't consider myself as a conductor. Our esteemed brother David Hooper said "if you can look after the organisation, administration and festival work, I will take care of the conducting". So I became area leader for York as well as secretary for the York choir.

Over the years I have been at many festivals all over Scotland, England and Wales: Glasgow, Edinburgh, Galashiels, Dunfermline, Aberdeen, Peterhead, Buckie, Inverness, Carlisle, Newcastle, Morecambe, Lancaster, Bolton, Derby, Sutton Coldfield, Cardiff and Swansea all spring to mind. The highlight was the North West Festivals tour of Oregon U.S.A. I remember with affection the various number of mini festivals we had with Carlisle. Bolton and Morecambe choirs uniting at different spots around Lancashire and Cumbria and even Melton Mowbray

Mark Mulley stepped down as Leader due to domestic circumstances and David Tingley, our Accompanist, took on the role, thus relinquishing his role as Treasurer. Andy Dole volunteered to accept the role of Choir Treasurer and was duly elected. The posts of Chairman, Secretary, Programme Coordinator, Publicity Team and Pastoral Carer remained as before and were unanimously accepted by the membership. Mark and Peter Hooker accepted the important posts of Conductor and Deputy conductor, thus we are able to function as a choir, if only small -10 members in total, but one in mind and spirit.

We have changed our practice venue this year; we meet in a small Evangelical Presbyterian church which is much easier for access and parking, especially as we now meet fortnightly on a Friday afternoon, and we have flexibility of time and access.

We are hoping to hold a Rally, if we can recruit some new members, and invite other choirs to come and join us. Hopefully, it would be during the summer or early autumn to enable other choirmen to travel during 'good' weather conditions and enable us to plan a Choir Meal before we would recommence practising again in September.

We sang at the Thanksgiving Service of one of our retired 1<sup>st</sup> Tenors on Monday 27th February 2023 at Cambray Baptist Church, where we used to practise on a Monday evening.
